Gre za jezikovne situacije, ki zajemajo dve ali več dejanj, ki se zgodijo v preteklosti. Na ta način jasno poudarimo, katero od dejanj se je zgodilo najprej oziroma je "najstarejše".

Dejanje, izraženo s past perfect simple časom, se zgodi najprej, drugo dejanje (ostala dejanja) se zgodijo šele po tem, ko se prvo konča.

V teh primerih začnemo ponavadi pripovedovati o dejanju, ki se je zgodilo kasneje (v past simple času), v drugem delu stavka pa pojasnimo, da se je dejanje, ki ga izrazimo v past perfect simple času, zgodilo najprej.

When Bill's wife arrived, he had left the house.

When I came home, I realized that someone had broken into my house.

After he had visited his mother, he went to see his father.

Before you came, I had finished reading the book.

When the boss came in, the employees hadn't finished their work yet.
